This flag I estimate was about 14 by 24 feet. There were about 4500 ladies attendance. Many wore beaded gowns. During the meeting the hall was aglow with sparkling stars from all the gowns.

The stage with all the lovely ladies all dressed in their finest looked like a bouquet of flowers. The address was give by The Honorable Phil Gramm, United States Senator from Texas. The Colors retired and the meeting was closed with organ






