OLD CORY RECIPE

THE MEMBERS OF THE MILLER-CORY HOUSE, IN WESTFIELD, NEW JERSEY, HAVE A COOKING COMMITTEE. THEY DO SOME OPEN HEARTH COOKING, MUCH AS THE EARLY SETTLERS DID IN THE 18th CENTURY. ONE OF THEIR FAVORITE RECIPES WAS FOR PUMPKIN SOUP. Serves 6-8 persons

3Tblspns butter, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup chopped onion, 2 cups pureed pumpkin, 3 cups chicken broth, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup light cream, 1 tspn salt, 1 tspn honey, $\frac{1}{4}$ tspn nutmeg, $\frac{1}{4}$ tspn white pepper. Saute onions slowly in butter until transparent. Add pumpkin, stir in chicken broth a little at a time. Add salt, pepper and nutmeg, stir. Cook over low heat about 15 minutes and stirring occasionally so soup does not burn. Slowly add cream and honey. Stir well, and heat to serving temperature. Serves 6-8 persons.
