We have much to admire in our ancestors who arrived on Long Island in the early 1600s. they truly made a difference wherever they settled. They were Town Clerks, served on committees to set boundaries, settle disputes, arrange for equitable treatment of towns people setup survey systems, etc.

PM - Visit East End Seaport, Maritime Museum, Main St. & Wharf; Commercial fishing pier. Some may wish to tour "Regina Maris", one of last two wooden sailing barkentines in world and possibly LIRR Museum. Also, evening at "Mary E", a 72' schooner for boating and fishing. Private parties for sunset or moonlight cruises.
