
CORY DESCENDANT WINS OLYMPICS GOLD MEDAL, 1984

CINDY NOBLE, A NATIVE OF ROSS COUNTY, OHIO, WAS ON THE FIRST UNITED STATES WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM IN HISTORY TO WIN A GOLD MEDAL AT THE OLYMPICS. HER BRIEF SPORTS CAREER HAS ALSO SHOWN MUCH DISTINCTION. CINDY HAS BEEN NAMED THE OUTSTANDING BASKETBALL PLAYER IN JAPAN, SHE HAS BEEN A MEMBER OF THE UNITED STATES PAN AMERICAN GOLD MEDAL TEAM, AND A MEMBER OF THE WINNING UNITED STATES WORLD UNIVERSITY CHAMPIONSHIP TEAM, AND AN OUTSTANDING HIGH SCHOOL PLAYER IN OHIO.

THE MILLER—CORY HOUSE,

ONCE CALLED A "LIVING MUSEUM," THE MILLER-CORY HOUSE IS NOW A "MUSEUM WITHOUT WALLS." EACH SUNDAY VISITORS ARE INTRODUCED TO A VARIETY OF COLONIAL SKILLS AS ARTISANS RE-CREATE THE LIFE, TASKS, AND CRAFTS OF 18th AND 19th CENTURY FARM FAMILY.

THE MILLER-CORY HOUSE WAS NAMED IN HONOR OF ITS TWO PRE-REVOLUTIONARY OWNERS, BOTH DESCENDANTS FROM THE AREA'S EARLIEST SETTLERS. THE MILLER-CORY HOUSE STANDS ON THE "ROAD TO THE MOUNTAINS" IN THE WESTFIELDS OF ELIZABETH. WHILE THE MILLERS AND CORYS WERE RURAL FARMERS, THEY WERE SMART, AS THE "WESTFIELDS" WERE AT THE CROSSROADS OF COLONIAL AMERICA ON THE OLD YORK ROAD, THE MAIN ROUTE FROM NEW YORK TO PHILADELPHIA.

THE MILLER-CORY HOUSE WAS BEGUN IN 1740 AT THE TIME OF THE MARRIAGE OF SAMUEL AND SABRA MILLER. IT WAS COMPLETED BEFORE 1782, AS IT IS MENTIONED IN MR. MILLER'S WILL OF THAT YEAR.

THE PROPERTY CAME TO JOSEPH CORY IN THE 1780'S, AND REMAINED IN THE CORY FAMILY UNTIL 1921. JOSEPH CORY DIED IN 1802 AND HIS INVENTORY OF THAT DATE HAS SET THE MODEL FOR THE FURNISHINGS IN THE HOUSE.



THE HOUSE WAS PURCHASED BY A CITIZEN'S COMMITTEE, DEEDED TO THE WESTFIELD HISTORICAL SOCIETY AND OPERATED AS A LIVING MUSEUM BY THE MILLER-CORY HOUSE ASSOCIATION. IT HAS BEEN CERTIFIED AS AN HISTORICAL SITE, AND HAS BEEN ENTERED ON BOTH THE STATE AND NATIONAL REGISTERS OF HISTORCAL PLACES.

THE MILLER-CORY MUSEUM IS OPEN EVERY SUNDAY, EXCEPT FOR HOLIDAY WEEKENDS. THE HOURS FROM SEPTEMBER TO JUNE ARE FROM 2-5 P.M., WITH THE EXCEPTION OF JANUARY AND FEBRUARY, WHEN THE MUSEUM IS OPEN FROM 2-4 P.M. THE MUSEUM IS CLOSED FROM MID-JUNE TO MID-SEPTEMBER.

HISTORY OF JOHN CORY I

MANY CORYS IN THE UNITED STATES CAN TRACE THEIR ANCESTORY BACK TO JOHN CORY I. THIS JOHN CORY CAME TO THIS COUNTRY ONLY TWENTY YEARS AFTER THE MAYFLOWER LANDED AT PLYMOUTH ROCK. THE FOLLOWING IS A SKETCH FROM THE BOOK "PIONEERS ALL, THE LINE OF McCOWIN," BY ALMA LEE McCOWIN, CUSTOM PRINTING, LOGAN, UTAH, 1981, PAGE 87.

JOHN CORY, THE FIRST IN AMERICA, WAS BORN ABOUT 1611, IN ENGLAND, PROBABLY AT BRAMERTON HALL, NEAR THE CITY OF NORWICH, COUNTY OF NORFOLK.

HE MARRIED ANN IN ENGLAND ABOUT 1637. HE CAME TO AMERICA IN 1640, AND LANDED AT OR NEAR BOSTON HARBOR. HE REMAINED A SHORT TIME IN MASSACHUSETTS AND THEN MOVED TO NEW HAVEN, COMMECTICUTT.

IN SEPTEMBER OF 1640, A PARTY OF TWELVE MEN, INCLUDING JOHN CORY, CROSSED OVER THE SOUND TO LONG ISLAND AND FOUNDED THE TOWN OF SOUTHOLD. THIS TOWN WAS BUILT AT THE SITE OF AN INDIAN VILLAGE WHOSE ABORIGINAL ALGONQUIL NAME WAS HASHAMOMACK, SO KNOWN IN THE LEGEL RECORDS UP TO 1659, WHEN THE NAME WAS CHANGED TO SOUTHOLD. IN THE RECORDS OF SOUTHAMPTON, LONG ISLAND, MARCH 7, 1644, JOHN CORY IS MENTIONED AS A WHALE COMMISSIONER FOR HIS DISTRICT. ON MARCH 8th, OF THE SAME YEAR, HE RECEIVED A GRANT OF LAND. ON OCTOBER 8, 1649, HE AND HIS WIFE, ANN CORY, WITNESSED A DEED IN SOUTHOLD, LONG ISLAND.

IN MAY OF 1659, WHEN LONG ISLAND STILL BELONGED TO THE NEW HAVEN, CONNECTICUTT COLONY, JOHN CORY, OF SOUTHOLD, REFUSED TO TAKE THE OATH OF ALLEGIANCE, BUT FINALLY DID IN THE SAME MONTH OF THE FOLLOWING YEAR TO THE SATISFACTION OF "YE CORTE" THAT HE WAS NO TRAITOR AND CONCEALING NO TREACHERY. "GOODMAN" CORY WAS MADE A FREE MAN OF CONNECTICUTT IN 1662. HE SEEMS TO HAVE BEEN A MAN OF CONSIDERABLE MEANS FOR THAT TIME AS HE OWNED SEVERAL HOUSE LOTS IN SOUTHOLD AND HUNTINGTON.

JOHN CORY BROUGHT WITH HIM TO AMERICA FROM ENGLAND "THE GRATE BOOKE," A GIFT FROM HIS MOTHER. THE RECORDS CALL THE CORY FAMILY OF THE QUAKER PERSUASION, BUT THERE IS ALSO A RECORD THAT JOHN CORY WAS ONE OF THE FOUNDERS IN 1640, OF THE FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF SOUTHOLD. HE WAS A WEAVER BY TRADE, AND DIED ON MARCH 7, 1685, AT HASHAMOMACK (SOUTHOLD), LONG ISLAND.

DEVON AND NORFOLK CORYS

AS ALL CORY FAMILY HISTORIANS KNOW, THERE ARE CORYS FROM THREE MAIN AREAS IN ENGLAND: CORNWALL, DEVON, AND NORFOLK. HARRY HARMON CORY'S BOOK, THE CORY FAMILY, SECOND EDITION, TRACES THE NORFOLK CORY FAMILY, AND THEIR SETTLING IN AMERICA. THERE IS NO SUCH BOOK THAT I AM AWARE OF THAT TRACES THE CORNWALL OR DEVON CORYS FROM THEIR ENGLISH ROOTS TO AMERICA.

IN ADDITION, THERE IS NO HARD EVIDENCE (BIRTH DATES, BAPTISM DATES, PARISH RECORDS) THAT TIE IN ALL OF THE VARIOUS BRANCHES OF THE CORY FAMILY FROM CORNWALL TOGETHER, OR THE BRANCHES OF THE CORNWALL, DEVON AND NORFOLK BRANCHES OF THE CORY FAMILY TOGETHER. YES, THERE ARE SOME SECONDARY REFERENCES THAT MERELY STATE THAT THEY ARE CONNECTED, BUT NO HARD EVIDENCE THAT WE CAN FIND.

IF YOU HAVE THIS <u>HARD EVIDNECE</u>, <u>PLEASE CONTACT JACK R. CORY</u>, AT 9744 SO. MASON, OAK LAWN, ILLINOIS, 60453. THANK YOU SO MUCH, AS IT IS ONE BIT OF CORY FAMILY DATA THAT WE HOPE TO SHARE WITH ONE ANOTHER.

ENGLAND AND SCOTLAND CORYS

TWO GENEALOGICAL RESEARCHES, MR. J.W. BASTIN, IN ENGLAND, AND MRS. KATHLEEN CORY IN SCOTLAND, BOTH FEEL THAT THERE IS NO FAMILY TIE IN BETWEEN THE SCOTTISH CORRIES AND THE ENGLISH CORYS OR COREYS. THEY POINT OUT THAT THE COAT OF ARMS ARE DIFFERENT, AND THERE IS NO HARD EVIDENCE THAT HAS EVER TURNED UP THAT MAKES ANY CONNECTION BETWEEN THESE TWO FAMILIES FROM THE TWO COUNTRIES.

CAN THAT BE TRUE? IS IT JUST "WISHFUL LINKING" TO THINK THAT THERE MIGHT BE SOME HARD EVIDENCE THAT MIGHT LINK THE SCOTTISH AND ENGLISH CORRIES/CORYS/COREYS? WELL, WE ARE NOT QUITE READY TO ADMIT THAT THERE IS NO CONNECTION UNTIL WE HAVE AT LEAST SEEN THE DATA OF THE BEGINNINGS OF THE ENGLISH CORYS/COREYS AND FIND THAT THEY DID NOT COME FROM SCOTLAND. THERE ARE SOME SECONDARY SOURCES THAT SAY THAT THERE IS A TIE IN, BUT THAT DOES NOT REALLY QUALIFY OR IS SUFFICIENT.

DO ANY OF YOU HAVE ANY HARD EVIDENCE THAT MAKES THE TIE IN BETWEEN THE SCOTTISH AND ENGLISH CORRIES/CORYS/COREYS? IF SO, PLEASE CONTACT JACK R. CORY, ADDRESS ABOVE. THANK YOU!

JOIN THE NATIONAL CORY SOCIETY

AS STRANGE AS IT MAY SEEM, THERE SEEMS NEVER FORMALLY TO HAVE BEEN ESTABLISHED A NATIONAL CORY FAMILY SOCIETY. WE ALL HOPE TO RECTIFY THIS IN THE YEAR TO COME.

AT THE CORY FAMILY REUNION, AT EAST PALESTINE, OHIO, ON SUNDAY, AUGUST 17, 1986, A WET OF BY-LAWS WILL BE PRESENTED TO ESTABLISH THE NATIONAL CORY SOCIETY. A VOTE WILL BE TAKEN, OFFICERS WILL BE ELECTED, AND DUES WILL BE SET TO ALLOW MAILINGS, CORRESPONDENCE, AND A NEWSLETTER. ONCE THE NATIONAL CORY SOCIETY IS ESTABLISHED, THEN COORDINATED AND SPECIFIC EFFORTS CAN BE MADE TO TRY TO MAKE CONNECTION WITH THE VARIOUS BRANCHES OF THE CORY FAMILY TREE. PLUS, CORY AND RELATED FAMILY NAMES WHO HAVE NOT BEEN ABLE TO MAKE CONNECTION WITH THEIR OWN BRANCH OF THE FAMILY TREE CAN RECEIVE SOME ASSISTANCE IN DOING THAT TASK.

EQUALLY AS IMPORTANT, FUTURE CORY AND RELATED FAMILY NAME MEMBERS WILL BE ABLE TO REAP ALL THE BENEFIT OF THE RESEARCH THAT CAN BE ACCUMULATED AND RGANIZED BY SUCH A MOVE TO COOPERATIVELY ESTABLISH THE CORY SOCIETY. THEY WILL HAVE SOME OFFICIAL PLACE TO GO TO RECEIVE THE DATA THEY NEED TO TRACE THEIR FAMILY ROOTS.

ONCE THE NATIONAL CORY FAMILY SOCIETY IS ESTABLISHED, THEN A PUSH WILL BE MADE TO ACCUMULATE IN ONE PLACE ALL THE RESEARCH DATA THAT HAS BEEN DONE SO THAT CONNECTIONS CAN BE MADE AND HISTORICAL DATA GIVEN. SO, LOOK FOR THE MAILING TO COME YOUR WAY AFTER THE AUGUST 17th MEETING IN OHIO, AND THE HOPE IS THAT YOU WILL BECOME A MEMBER OF THE CORY FAMILY HISTORICAL SOCIETY TO ASSIT IN THE COLLECTION AND ORGANIZATION OF THE CORY HISTORICAL DATA FOR ALL.

I HAVE BEEN IN CONTACT WITH PEOPLE FROM MISSESOTA, TO WASHINGTON, TO FLORIDA, TO OHIO, TO IOWA, TO ARKANSAS, TO NEW JERSEY, TO ALABAMA, AND I KNOW THAT THERE ALREADY HAS BEEN A GREAT DEAL OF HISTORICAL WORK DONE ON MANY, MANY BRANCHES OF THE CORY FAMILY TREE, AND WE NEED TO COLLECT ALL THAT DATA IN ONE PLACE, SO THAT OTHER CORY FAMILY MEMBERS MAY HAVE ACCESS TO IT. AFTER ALL, THE PURPOSE IS TO ASSIST ONE ANOTHER IN THEIR GENEALOGICAL PURSUIT, RIGHT?

SUPPORT FOR THIS CORY NEWSLETTER

AS YOU WILL READ ELSEWHERE IN THIS CORY NEWSLETTER, WE HOPE TO ESTABLISH A NATIONAL CORY FAMILY SOCIETY, WITH SET DUES THAT WILL OFFSET THE COST OF ANY NEWSLETTER WE PUBLISH.
