CORY FAMILY NEWSLETTER NOTES ON JOB CORY

Job Cory was named after his Grandfather, who was one of the early settlers of Sparta, New Jersey.

Grandfather Job Cory was a blacksmith by trade, and a large owner of real estate.

His wife was Jane Morrow, and they had four sons: David, James, William, and Silas, and three daughters: Rohamy, who married Siren Wade, Betsey, who married Francis Mariam, and Polly, who married Thomas Denny. David is the son who is the father of our subject, Job Cory.

David was born September 11, 1791, and was a blacksmith and a farmer. He married Martha Wade on September 20, 1812. Their children were Jane, Samuel, Job, Charles, Frank M., Thomas D., Eliza, Mary, David M., and Martha. David was a farmer his whole life, and an Elder in the Presbyterian Church for

almost 30 years. David died on January 1, 1869, and his wife was born on September 8, 1794, and died on August 6, 1876.

Job Cory, our subject, was born on June 22, 1818, and married Joanna P. Lanterman in January, 1840. Their children were Cornelia, who married Samuel Bucks; Ella, wife of William Evart; Frank M.; and Eugene.

Job Cory received a liberal education during his early life, was a well read man, and was a farmer all his life.

He became a member of the Presbyterian Church in 1840, was an Elder, and took a lively interest in the life of the Church. He was a member of the Republican Party, and was elected to various positions of trust in Sparta Township, New Jersey. His date of death was not listed in this material.

CLINT COREY, FROM SILVERDALE, WASHINGTON, WAS IN THE QUEST FOR A NATIONAL BAREBACK BRONC RIDING CHAMPIONSHIP IN 1986. CLINT IS SHOWN TO THE RIGHT ON A HORSE CALLED RYE GRASS, AND GAVE THE TOP RIDE THE NIGHT OF SATURDAY, AUGUST 23, 1986, WITH A 74 POINT RIDE, IN THE KITSAP STAMPEDE IN BREMERTON, WASHINGTON. SCOTT COREY, OLDER BROTHER OF CLINT, WAS THIRD THAT NIGHT WITH A 68 POINT RIDE.

OVERALL WINNER OF THE WHOLE STAMPEDE WAS CHUCK LOGUE. CLINT COREY FINISHED FOURTH OVERALL, AND CLAIMED \$454.93 WINNINGS.



ELIAS COREY

Dr. Elias J. Corey, Professor of Chemistry at Harvard University, along with five colleagues, synthesized the compound ginkgolide B, of the ginkgo tree, that is supposed to have great healing powers. Dr. Corey completed this work in 1988.

A form of the ginkgo first appeared 300 million years ago, and the surviving species, Ginkgo biloba, is sacred to Buddhists in China and Japan. For at least 5,000 years, an extract of the ginkgo leaf has been recommended in Chinese medicine for asthma, coughs, and allergies.

The chemical structure of the natural substance was discovered earlier by Koji
Nakanishi of Columbia University, and the molecule is so complex other laboratories had
given up on trying to synthesize it. It could lead to widespread use in treating asthma,
toxic shock, Alzheimer's disease, and various circulatory disorders. Congratulations!

HE HOLDS A PhD DEGREE FROM INDIANA UNIVERSITY, HAS TAUGHT AND BEEN A WORLD-WIDE CONSULTANT, AND WORKED WITH THE U.S. OPYMPIC COMMITTEE.

THE CORY COPPER KETTLE IS A 30 GALLON, HAND WROUGHT COPPER KETTLE, MADE BEFORE THE REVOLUTIONARY WAR. IT CAME FROM THE FARM OF JOSEPH CORY OF ELIZABETHTOWN, NEW JERSEY, WHO WAS THE GREAT, GREAT GRANDSON OF JOHN CORY¹.

THE KETTLE IS MADE OUT OF SHEET COPPER AND THE BOTTOM AND SIDES WERE KEYED TOGETHER AND WELDED TO PREVENT THE BOTTOM FROM TEARING OUT. THE KETTLE IS PICTURED TO THE RIGHT. THE KETTLE STAYED IN THE CORY FAMILY, AND IN THE 18th CENTURY WAS IN CHILLICOTHE, ROSS COUNTY, OHIO. A GROUP OF FARMERS BUILT A HUGE RAFT, TOOK FARM PRODUCE AND LIVESTOCK DOWN THE RIVERS TO NEW ORLEANS WHERE THEY SOLD IT. THE KETTLE WENT ALONG TO COOK IN, AND THE FARMERS THEN WALKED BACK, CARRYING THE KETTLE TO



COOK IN ON THE WAY BACK. THE KETTLE IS IN THE POSSESSION OF MRS. JOANNE CORY FRENCH, THE DAUGHTER OF HARRY HARMON CORY, ON THEIR FARM IN ROCKFORD, MINNESOTA.




