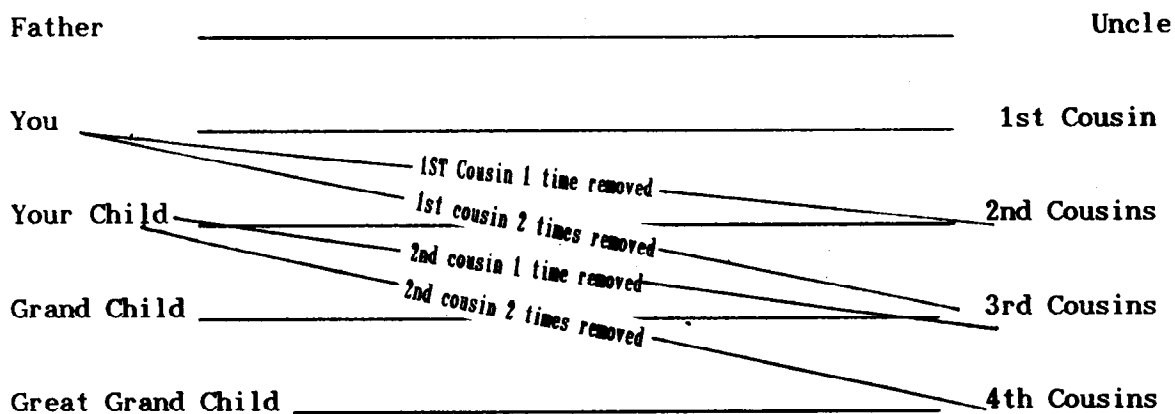

Hi, COUSINS.....

Is the difference between a second cousin and a first cousin twice removed of deep mystery to you? First, you must understand just what is a cousin. This is an easy one.

Your cousins are children born to either an Aunt or an Uncle. These are called first cousins. Next take the second cousins. This, too, is fairly simple. If you have a child and your first cousin has a child they - presto are second cousins, look at the chart. Third cousins are the children born of second cousins etc.

Now if you have this cousin business clearly in your mind it is not to difficult a step to understand the "once removed" and "twice removed" part. You know for instance, that if your first cousin has a child that this child bears a relationship to you and vice versa. What to call it? That child would not be a second cousin, obviously, because as we have seen second cousins is a relationship which children of first cousins bear to each other.

So, if your first cousin has a child you need another name for that relationship. That's where "removed" comes in. A child born to your first cousin is simply and purley what is known as a first cousin once removed. Now, if that child becomes a parent, your relationship to the off spring will be a first cousin twice removed. This same system is in effect for labeling kinship between second cousins, third cousins, etc. For instance, your second cousin has a child. That would be your second cousin once removed. A child born to him would in turn be your second cousin twice removed and so on. SIMPLE WHAT!

John I, Son Abraham our Uncle, His son is My 1st cousin 7 times removed..He is a 1st cousin 10 times removed from Mark Hester. Mark Hester and I are 6th Cousins 3 times removed "common ancestor is John III". Helen Mercier and I are 5th Cousins, "common ancestor is John IV"

THE CORY FAMILY SOCIETY
BYLAWS

1. The duty of the executive committee shall be to represent the family organization during the interval between Annual Meetings, to recommend the time and place of the annual meeting and to perform other work which may be delegated to the committee by the family organization.
2. The President shall exercise general supervision over the family organization, to call special meetings of the Executive Committee as necessary to carry on the work of the family organization during the period between annual meetings. The President shall attend all Annual Meetings and meetings of the Executive Committee. He shall submit to the family at the Annual Meeting a report of all official acts of the Committee and any other information and recommendations of importance.
3. The Vice Presidents shall carry out the policies of the family organization by developing and administering programs within their assigned spheres of activities. These programs shall be approved by the Executive Committee. The Vice-Presidents shall assist and counsel the President in all matters of the family organization activities. The Vice-Presidents shall act in behalf of the President in his absence.
4. The Secretary shall keep accurate minutes of Annual Meetings and all meetings of the Executive Committee and perform other secretarial duties as directed by the President or the Executive Committee.
5. The Treasurer shall receive and keep an accurate account of all dues, contributions and other moneys received by and in behalf of the Cory Family Society, and to handle all expenditures and disbursements for and in behalf of the Cory Family Society.
6. The Genealogist shall supervise and direct the compilation of complete and accurate genealogical records of the Cory Family. Appointed assistants, approved by the President, shall help supervise the collection of data as a committee with the Genealogist as chairman. The Committee shall have the authority to call upon family members for data and assistance in research and shall engage as many family members who will respond to this effort. Supervising, counseling and teaching when necessary. If necessary and subject to approval of the Executive Committee, the Genealogist may employ a professional researcher.
7. The historian shall supervise and direct the compilation and writing of biographical records, family histories and personal histories pertaining to the Cory family. Assistants, with approval of the President, may be selected as necessary.
8. The annual dues of the family shall be \$10.00 per year. Additional funds may be requested according to financial needs of the family organization in administering their programs. dues shall be paid on or before the date of the Annual Meeting or other such date specified by the President or Executive Committee.
9. The Bylaws of the Cory Family Society may be amended, altered or added to by a majority vote of members present at the Annual Meeting.

Robert de Cory received a grant of land in 23rd year of the reign of King David II (1324-1371) of Scotland and again in the 40th year of his reign, lands were granted to this Robert de Cory. Robert CORY was Knighted during the reign of Robert II (1316-1390) of Scotland in 1362. (Robert II was the grand son of Robert, the Bruce, and founded the House of Stuart.) In 1368 a Robert Cory of Annandale, Shire of Dumfries, Scotland, was granted a safe conduct by Edward III with mounted escort to England.
William CORY of Bramerton Hall, Norwich married and had

Any Cory Decendant of John CORY I is eligible for membership in the National Society of Magna Charta Dames, Sovereign Colonial Society Americans of Royal Decent, and the Plantagnet Society.

Tid Bits:

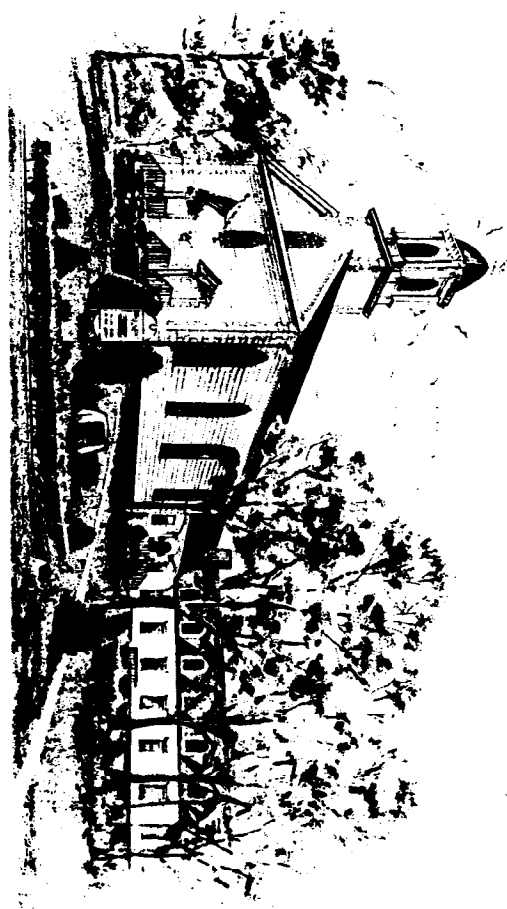
CORRY PA near the East line of the County of Erie was named after Hiram Corry in 1861. (It is said Hiram was a Captain of a Slave Ship).

Mt. CORY in Western part of Hancock Co. OH was named in Honor of Judge David Cory.

William Corry born about 1715 came to America with his wife Margaret and family from the Providence of Ulster, Ireland in to the Colony of south Carolina May 28, 1767. Many of their Children lived and died in Greene Co Ga. (Ed note: Would be nice to get this line into the Cory Family Society.)
