#### **OUR LIBRARY VISIT**

Hopefully I can shed some light on any ones first visit to the Mormon History Center's Libraries. Many of the Local Churches have Branch Libraries where you can do research and have access to just about every thing located in the main library in Salt Lake. To answer the first Question, No you don't have to belong to the Mormon faith to use their facilities. Marilee and I both work as Librarians in one of the Branches and we are not Mormons.

We are going to visit the Main Family History Library of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saint in Salt Lake.. The Library began in 1894, and since that beginning it has become the largest of its kind in the world. They have over 1.7 million rolls of microfilm records, over 200,00 books, 9 million family.

group records forms and may other
records. The originals of the microfilms
are preserved in a large cave vault in
the mountains near Salt Lake City.
The vault is man or nature proof,
nothing can destroy the records. (Your
records if you have sent them to me)
They will be there in for ever.

The best place to start is to use the Family History Library Catalog (FHLC). This is on fiche or on compact disc for use with a computer. The FHLC can help you find your family by location through the locality search (State, County, or City) deed, wills, probate records etc.

The International Genealogical Index (IGI) This record is on Micro fische or compact disc for computer use. You choose your State or Country that you are researching, the last name of the family. The IGI will give you birth dates, places, mother and fathers, and marriages and place of incident. This index contains over 200 million names of deceased persons from throughout the World. Don't look for living people, they wont be in there. Many of the names come from Vital records

researched by the Latter Day Saints Field personal, and from our research that we have submitted for archiving. Ancestral File™ is one of the several files in Family Search®, a computerized system of genealogical information, developed by the LDS Church.

LDS church collects the The genealogies of families through out the world and make them available for us to research via the Ancestral File. The file connects families through pedigree charts and family group sheets. The file contains millions of individuals from many countries. The information includes names, along with dates and places of birth, marriage and death. The majority of the information is of deceased people. This file also contains the names of the individuals that submitted the information. This source for research is a must.

The U.S. Social Security Death Index is an index of 40 million deceased people who have had a social security number and whose death has been reported to the Social Security. The index mainly covers deaths between 1962 and the end of 1989. You do not need the Social Security number of the

person you are looking for. You can usually find birth and death dates, last place of residence, (which will help you get a death certificate or obituary) Identify the state where your ancestor lived when they were issued a social security number. It will also give you the social security number, to help get more information from the Social Security Administration.

The Military Index list individuals in the U.S. military service who died or were declared dead in Korea or Vietnam from 1950 to 1975. There are two indexes available, one for Korea and one for Vietnam. The indexes will give you birth and death dates, Residence location at time of enlistment, identify the country where they may have died. Rank Service number and branch of service. Tells the Race of the individual. For Vietnam only you will find the identity of the persons date tour of duty started, religious affiliation and martial status.

There is lots of help, ask for it. The library staff are there to help you. Be sure and check the books for surnames you are researching.
