2nd ANNUAL CORY FAMILY REUNION

The second Annual National CORY Family Reunion was held in Chicago, Illinois June 22 through the 24th 1990. Some 36 Family members gathered to renew old acquaintance make new friends, share information and have some good fun and fellowship together. The Cory's that were there were from many different lines starting with John I, William and Samuel. We are still looking for some of Giles Cory's ancestors.

Our Speaker Mr. Vernon Cory a member of the National Cory Family Society from Harrogate, North Yorkshire, England. Vernon gave two lectures "The Cory's in England and Wales in History," and "The Migration of the Cory's to America". These lectures were excellent, informing and assisted in the understanding of English origins of the Cory Family. Vernon pointed out that it was the west Country Cory's who were probably the earliest settlement of Cory's living at the Manor of Chori, about 12 miles North of Launceston Cornwall England mentioned in the Domesday Book Commissioned by William the Conqueror in 1086. Two centuries later, the Village of Chori had become Great Cory, with satellites such as West Cory, Little Cory and East Cory. All were very small Hamlets, with the Parish in Boyton. It is from one of these settlements that Robert Corie who in the 13th century left West country and traveled to settle in the East, at Norwich Norfolk, England. It was here that the Cory's established a Dynasty, including the Homestead mansion in Bramerton. It is likely from somewhere

in this East dynasty of Cory came John I who came to America and settled in Southold Long Island New York. But we have no factual dates or evidence that he came from Bramerton. About the same time, other Cory's came to America, they were William who settled Rhode Island, Thomas who settled in Chelmsford Mass, Giles who settled at Salem Mass. All of these Cory's are traceable around 1640. Most of the Cory, Corey, Coray and some of the Corry's living in America can trace their heritage and lineage back to one of these four. There were many Cory families who came later, even after the revolutionary war and on into the 19th Century from the West country of England. Many of the West country Cory's settled in Launceston, and one Cory was even Mayor. Vernon and his colleague Michael Cory from Dorset will be active researching England for us.

In addition to the two fascinating lectures by Vernon we all took a ride and tour of Chicago, had lunch downtown and rode the express elevator to the 94th floor of the Hancock Building for a birds eye view of Chicago. Sunday we assembled at the United Methodist Church where our very dear cousin Jack is the pastor, he gave a very inspiring sermon. Our annual meeting and banquet was held at the Holiday Inn at Mattison a hamlet south of Chicago. Helen Cory Mercier and Edna Snell were Honored for their vast amount of work and devotion over the years of compiling Cory history. They were given Life Membership in the National Cory Family Society.

or 64 is 50 plus 10 Plus 4
150 is C plus L = CL
or 150 is 100 plus 50

THE CORY FAMILY SOCIETY

BYLAWS

1. The duty of the executive committee shall be to represent the family organization during the interval between Annual Meetings, to recommend the time and place of the annual meeting and to perform other work which may be delegated to the committee by the family organization.
2. The President shall exercise general supervision over the family organization, to call special meetings of the Executive Committee as necessary to carry on the work of the family organization during the period between annual meetings. The President shall attend all Annual Meetings and meetings of the Executive Committee. He shall submit to the family at the Annual Meeting a report of all official acts of the Committee and any other information and recommendations of importance.
3. The Vice Presidents shall carry out the policies of the family organization by developing and administering programs within their assigned spheres of activities. These programs shall be approved by the Executive Committee. The Vice-Presidents shall assist and counsel the President in all matters of the family organization activities. The Vice-Presidents shall act in behalf of the President in his absence.
4. The Secretary shall keep accurate minutes of Annual Meetings and all meetings of the Executive Committee and perform other secretarial duties as directed by the President or the Executive Committee.
5. The Treasurer shall receive and keep an accurate account of all dues, contributions and other moneys received by and in behalf of the Cory Family Society, and to handle all expenditures and disbursements for and in behalf of the Cory Family Society.
6. The Genealogist shall supervise and direct the compilation of complete and accurate genealogical records of the Cory Family. Appointed assistants, approved by the President, shall help supervise the collection of data as a committee with the Genealogist as chairman. The Committee shall have the authority to call upon family members for data and assistance in research and shall engage as many family members who will respond to this effort. Supervising, counseling and teaching when necessary. If necessary and subject to approval of the Executive Committee, the Genealogist may employ a professional researcher.
7. The historian shall supervise and direct the compilation and writing of biographical records, family histories and personal histories pertaining to the Cory family. Assistants, with approval of the President, may be selected as necessary.
8. The annual dues of the family shall be \$10.00 per year. Additional funds may be requested according to financial needs of the family organization in administering their programs. dues shall be paid on or before the date of the Annual Meeting or other such date specified by the President or Executive Committee.

The Bylaws of the Cory Family Society may be amended, altered or added to by a majority vote of members present at the Annual Meeting.

¹ COREY Gideon, son of COREY Thomas and CORY (DRAKE) Elizabeth. Born, 21 Mar 1757, in East Greenwich, Kent Co RI. Died, 14 Jul 1822, in New Canaan, Queens Co NB CND. In the year 1783, May the 18th, Gideon and his wife, Abigail Clarke, came to the shores at Parrtown, now Saint John New Brunswick, as United Empire Loyalist, the ones who were loyal to the British crown after the Revolution, in which the United States of America defeated the British. They disembarked from the British transport ship UNION, in Saint John harbour. Gideon, Cooper by trade, militiaman in war, and United Empire Loyalist by choice settled in Hampstead near Gagetown. In 1793 Gideon, wife Abigail and children moved to New Canaan where he farmed, taught night school and raised his family. Many of his descendants to day are to be found in and around that part of Canada.

He married CLARKE Abigail (Dau of Elisha and Desire (Gardner) Clarke), circa 1783 (?), in North Kingston, Washington Co RI. Born, circa 1766 (?), in North Kingston, Washington Co RI. Died, circa 1849 (?), in New Canaan, Queens Co NB CND. Children:

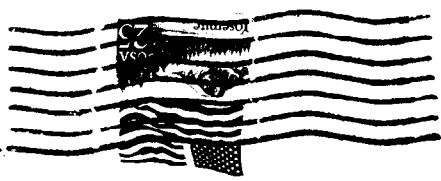
